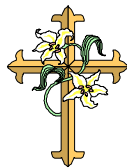

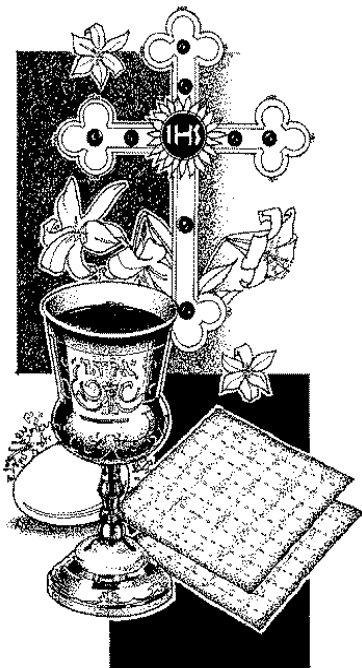

AUGUST: What You Should Know About Mortgage Insurance

Did you purchase a new house recently? Congratulations! On a more sobering note, this is one of the biggest purchases you'll ever make - and probably came with a sizable mortgage. FROM THE CHAPLAIN:

Sunday, August 15 is The Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, the Mother of God. The Gospel of Luke for the Solemnity tells us:

+ “My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord.....He has cast down the mighty from their throne and has lifted up the lowly.”



Call it the Breviary. The Office, The Liturgy of the Hours; anyone who prays those prayers daily encounters the Magnificat, Mary’s Prayer each evening in Evening Prayer.

The image we have of Mary is often that of one of her statues or paintings; the flawless presentations of her at the Christmas Manger, the exquisite visions of Fatima and Lourdes, the icons of Mary that we have seen at our Prayer Services.

She is beautiful, holy and remote.

But for Luke, Mary is a real woman who pays a heavy price for her “yes” to God: the tension with her husband, Joseph, the dangerous trip to Bethlehem, the pain of childbirth, alone, in a stable cave; the desperate flight to Egypt; the helplessness of watching her innocent Son’s death. She is not a bystander. She is a real woman of joys, struggles, parenthood, poverty and life at its hardest.

Luke makes this real woman the First Preacher of the Gospel. In her chosenness, Mary understands what God will do in and through Jesus Christ. She knows that in the promise she has received, history is changed forever. She knows that she is the lowly one whom God has lifted up, the loving daughter upon whom God has looked with favor.

Mary’s Magnificat is anything but a pious ode of a plastic saint. It is a prophetic, cutting-edge proclamation of faithful conviction in the living, creative presence of God. The Solemnity of the Assumption is Mary’s Easter, the lifting up of the Magnificat. Her song can be our song of gratitude for God’s loving presence in our lives.
