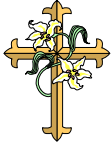

Every Monday, *The New York Times*, publishes the wonderful "Metropolitan Diary" column. "Diary" is a collection of short stories and happenings sent in by readers that reflect the quirkiness of living in the "Big Apple."

A few weeks ago, a correspondent wrote of losing his wallet on the subway. A young man named Paul found the wallet and returned it, refusing to take any reward. So the owner of the wallet decided to write a letter to Paul's nine-month-old son, Malachy:

Dear Malachy:

I wanted to tell you why we met, because your father thought his act of kindness was not worthy of a boast. But seeing the love that surrounds you, I think you deserve to know what little I know of your father, Paul.

We were fellow travelers on the subway at 34th St., separated by moments. As I sped along, your father stopped. He stopped long enough to find my wallet. It had little monetary value, but its return was priceless.

Your father went a lot further than the person who stopped to pick up my wallet and place it on a railing. Your father took the time to find its rightful owner. Searching through the stack of stuff and cards in the wallet he discovered my identity and my place of work. He found me and would take no reward.

In a city of millions your father became a singularly important person. He did what each of us should strive to do - perform acts of kindness for each other.

Your father was willing to make sure that a single wallet made it home. Just think about what he would do to make sure that you, someone he loves immeasurably, will make it home safely, too. I am sure your mother feels the same way.

So, search the heavens, but look around you for your angels.

To be a disciple of Jesus is not simply to be a "hired hand" who acts only to be compensated; who is concerned only with his own welfare. Real followers of Jesus realize that every person possesses the sacred dignity of being a child of God and rejoices in knowing that in serving others he/she serves God. In "laying down" our own lives for our brother and sister "sheep" - we will one day "Take up" our lives in the Easter promise of God the Father.
