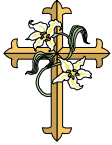

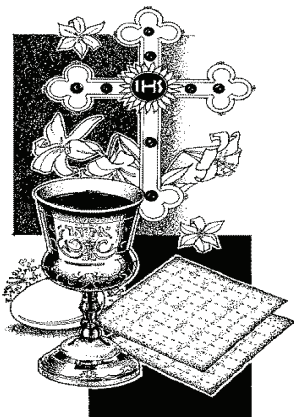

June 06

On Corpus Christi Sunday, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we read from the Gospel of Mark:

+Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it and gave it to them and said, "Take it, this is my body." Then he took the cup, gave thanks, gave it to them, and they all drank from it: "This is my blood of the covenant which will be shed for many...." Mark 14:12-16, 22-26



Fourteen-year-old Becca had a very rare form of cancer. Her chance for survival was slim. Becca's only hope was an aggressive protocol of chemotherapy and radiation which she handled with courage and grace far beyond her years.

In Becca's family, Sunday dinner was always a big deal. With so many busy schedules, Mom and Dad and the children made a point of sitting down to a big dinner on Sunday evening. On this particular Sunday, Mom spent the day with Becca at the hospital. So Dad and Becca's sister and brothers decided to bring Sunday dinner to the hospital.

Easier said than done: Dad was a whiz with the grill on the patio, but negotiating the kitchen to prepare a full Sunday dinner was another matter. But Dad and the children were determined to enjoy every Sunday dinner they could together, so they got organized and soon roast chicken, mashed potatoes, vegetables salad and dessert were ready. They wrapped and packed it all up and hauled it to the hospital. There in the hospital cancer ward, for what could well be one of the last times, Mom and Dad, Becca and her sister and brothers broke bread together as a loving family.

+Just as a Sunday evening family supper, lovingly prepared, brings Becca and her family together, so does the Supper of the Lord bring us together as Church. The Christ of compassion and peace calls Becca, her family and us to His table to be nourished by the bread and wine that is in Him and of Him. We come to Eucharist to celebrate our true identity as Christ's disciples, just as Becca's Mom and Dad, sister and brothers came together with her to share their identity as family, to sustain themselves in the sometimes and often difficult demands of discipleship. May all of our family tables be a reflection of the table of Eucharist we share. May all of our family table be also places of compassion, peace, forgiveness and joy where Christ is present in our loving concern for one another.

Grand Knight's Column

Dear Brother Knights



On the 22nd of June we celebrate the feast of St. Mary Magdelene "The Penitent" DID YOU KNOW that St. Mary was given the name 'Magdalen' because, though a Jewish girl, she lived in a Gentile town called Magdale, in northern Galilee, and her culture and manners were those of a Gentile. St. Luke records that she was a notorious sinner, and had seven devils removed from her. She was present at Our Lords' Crucifixion, and with Joanna and Mary, the mother of James and Salome, at Jesus' empty tomb. Fourteen years after Our Lord's death, St. Mary was put in a boat by the Jews without sails or oars - along with Sts. Lazarus and Martha, St. Maximin (who baptized her), St. Sidonius ("the man born blind"), her maid Sera, and the body of St. Anne, the mother of the Blessed Virgin. They were sent drifting out to sea and landed on the shores of Southern France, where St. Mary spent the rest of her life as a contemplative in a cave known as Sainte-Baume. She was given the Holy Eucharist daily by angels as her only food, and died when she was 72. St. Mary was transported miraculously, just before she died, to the chapel of St. Maximin, where she received the last sacraments. Some people were surprised that Jesus let such a sinner touch Him, but Our Lord could see into Mary's heart, and He said: "Many sins are forgiven her, because she has loved very much." Then to Mary He said kindly, "Your faith has made you safe; go in peace." In like manor when we receive the sacrament of penance our priest tells us our sins are forgiven and to go in peace.

Our month of May 2006 was very active from our local council, 4th Degree Assembly and State Council perspective. We renewed our devotion to Our Blessed Mother by saying not only our Daily Rosary but conducting a rosary service following the 5PM Mass every Saturday in the month of May. At the K of C Columbus Diocese Awards ceremony Dave and Kathy Baker were named as the Columbus Chapter Family of the Year. Congratulations Dave a Kathy. Your dedication and achievements exemplify the initiative and involvement that is counted on to constantly improve the quality of life for many individuals. We provided parking assistance and ushers for our St Pius X Confirmation class and after the confirmation ceremonies attend our Business meeting where we conducted our election of Officers for the 2006/2007 fraternal year. During the Assembly Meeting this month the new slate of officers was elected and our 4th degree candidates were introduced. The 4th degree exemplification was conducted on 20/21 May 2006.
