The Council officers for the upcoming year have been elected, and will be installed at a special Mass on Wednesday, July 11th. Please join us for this special occasion.

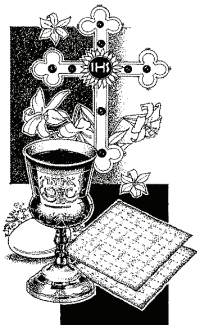

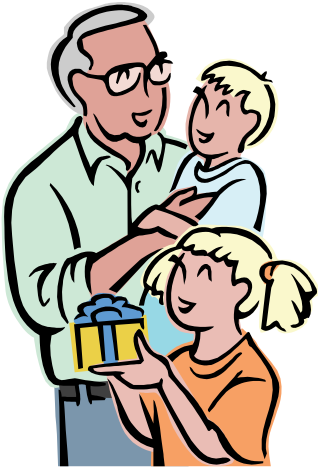
